Key Accountabilities

Safety, Quality and Risk

- Support the development and implementation of the IPC and Antimicrobial Stewardship programmes in alignment with the National IPC and AMS strategies and the hospital's Strategy and Business Plan and Quality Plan to ensure risks of infection are minimised.
- Support and advise the Clinical Nurse Specialist IPC and the Quality and Risk Manager on matters relating to IPC
- Contributes to development and review of national IPC policies and guidelines as necessary and disseminates these in the hospital as needed
- Supports the hospital in achieving, maintaining and exceeding the IPC Certification Standards
- Monitors compliance with appropriate and recognised professional standards, Nga Paerewa Health and Disability Services Standard for Infection Prevention and Antimicrobial Stewardship and provide evidence of this at certification audits
- Supports the CNS IPC and works with National IPC to develop and implement systems that improve clinical quality and decrease clinical risk.
- Monitors for breaches in practice which may contribute to adverse event investigations and implements changes in practice/equipment/environment where necessary.
- Collaborates with the hospital CNS/IPC, Quality Manager/Health and Safety Coordinator to review IPC adverse events, implement prevention strategies were identified and evaluate effectiveness
- Supports and collaborates on national and international quality initiatives such as the HQSC Hand Hygiene initiatives and International IPC week and implements these in the hospital.
- Contributes to the Safety, Quality, and Risk Management (SQRM) committee and Hospital Infection Prevention and Control Committee.

Surveillance of Infection

- Contributes to the hospital surgical site surveillance programme, analyses data and reports findings to the relevant specialists and committees.
- Assists with the investigation of any clusters of infection identified from surveillance activities.
- Assists with MDRO surveillance in the hospital as required
- Supports the monitoring of processes for surveillance of high risk equipment eg. Endoscopes where these are used and acts on results as necessary.

Safe Environment

- In collaboration with facilities manager reviews building environmental monitoring to ensure any risk of infection is addressed e.g. water test reports.
- With guidance, supports the risk assessment and monitoring during any hospital building/renovation projects and gives appropriate advice on how to manage infection risks and design out risks where possible.

Education and Learning

- Promotes IPC evidence to support practice and accesses relevant resources to inform this approach.
- Assists with IPC link meetings and education so they can actively contribute to and role model good practice to others.
- In liaison with the Nurse Educator and with guidance and support from Clinical Nurse Specialist IPC, provides education on IPC related issues to clinical and non-clinical employees as required.
- Assists with the development of IPC resources for consumer/visitor education where needed.
- Provides patient education/information as needed.
- Role models exceptional IPC practice.

Collaboration for an integrated approach

- Develops and maintains collaborative relationships with Medical Specialists, other health providers, patients and the community
- Collaborates with Health and Safety Coordinators on issues relating to IPC and employee wellbeing
- Contributes to discussions about proposed changes to staffing, practises, product, equipment or facilities (including renovation and new builds) that may have an IPC impact.
- Contributes to the Hospital IPC Committee processes and reports as needed.
- Contributes to reports to Hospital Clinical Governance Committee as required.
- Contributes to the review of the Hospital IPC Plan with the guidance of the Clinical Nurse Lead IPC

Own Professional Development
