
As part of a small, supportive team, you'll contribute across the wider fundraising programme when necessary.

Ngā Mahi | Do

- Develop and implement annual plans and targets for philanthropy, contributing to the wider fundraising strategy and long-term growth of the programme.
- Identify, cultivate and steward a portfolio of mid and major donors, building genuine relationships and creating meaningful engagement opportunities.
- Design and lead a Gifts in Wills programme, including developing resources and marketing materials, and building a strong pipeline of pledgers.
- Identify and nurture potential supporters, who may consider leaving a gift in their will in future, using thoughtful engagement and communication strategies.
- Oversee the stewardship of confirmed Gifts in Wills supporters, ensuring thoughtful and personalised stewardship.
- Work closely with frontline and communication colleagues to tell compelling stories that connect donors with the impact of their giving.
- In collaboration with the Direct Marketing Specialist, create and manage donor journeys, for new and existing mid and major donors.
- Develop and guide strategies, proposals and cases for support for major gifts, ensuring alignment with organisational priorities and impact.
- Support the development of Victim Support's investment fund by identifying and nurturing philanthropic opportunities that contribute to long-term sustainability.
- Monitor and report on the performance of fundraising activities, maintaining accurate
 CRM records and pipelines to support forecasting and reporting.
- Ensure all philanthropy activities align with fundraising ethics, privacy obligations and Victim Support's policies and values.
- Stay up-to-date with fundraising best practices and industry trends, applying these to strengthen and innovate Victim Support's philanthropy work.

- Proven ability to plan strategically and translate ideas into effective donor engagement activities.
- Sound analytical skills and attention to detail, with experience interpreting data and identifying insights to inform strategy.
- Knowledge of fundraising compliance, ethics and relevant legislative requirements.
- Proficient in using CRM and fundraising software. Experience with Salesforce is an advantage.
- A self-starter with initiative, sound judgement, and the ability to work independently or collaboratively within a small team.
- Agile and adaptable, comfortable managing shifting priorities and deadlines.
- A genuine enthusiasm for connecting with people, whether by phone, face-to-face or through digital channels.
- Commitment to working in a values-led, inclusive, and collaborative way that reflects the principles of Te Tiriti o Waitangi.
